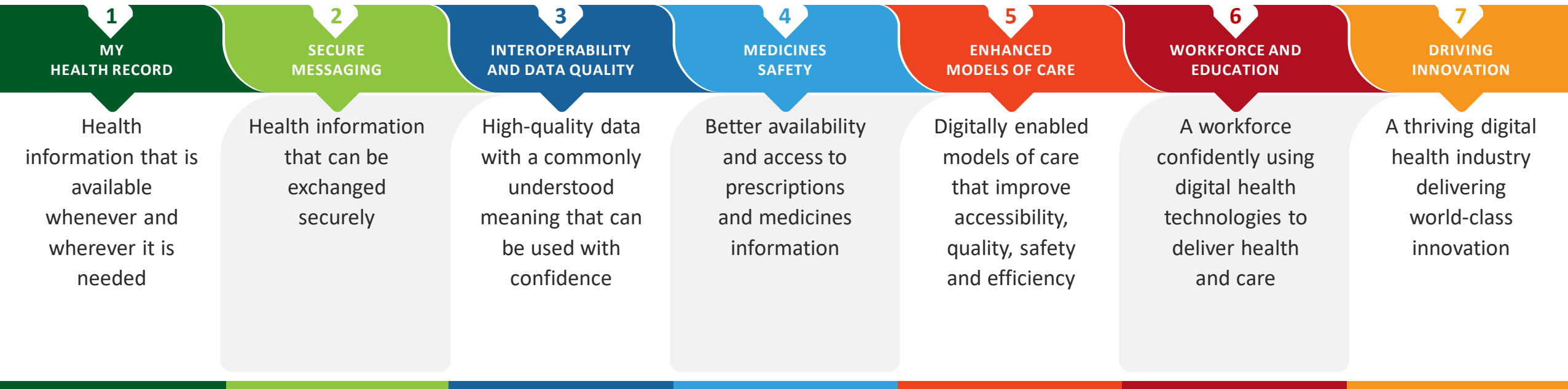

National Digital Health Strategy – roadmap for delivery

Co-designed with all states and territories



Research identifying challenges to providing care

- Limited opportunities for medication reconciliation during transition of care
- Limited access to complete and current health and social information
- Inability to recall or articulate medical history properly.
- Important information about patients' medical histories on admission to acute care settings cannot be accessed
- The mode and effectiveness of information transmission is variable, as well as the variation in digital health literacy of staff in aged care setting .



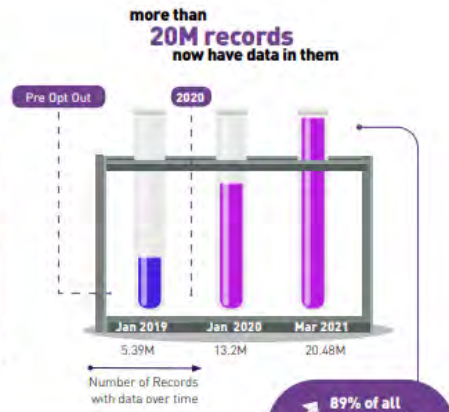
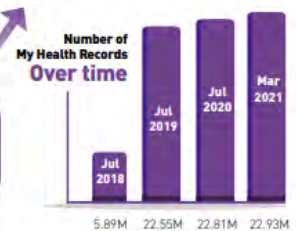

My Health Record Statistics and Insights MARCH 2021

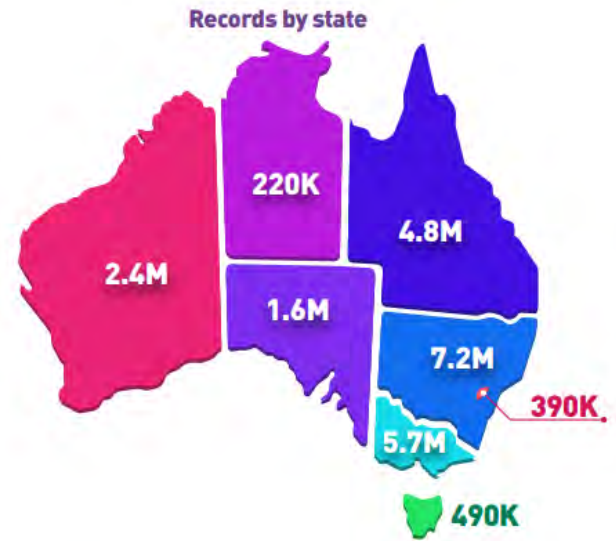
22.93M Total My Health Records

When you have a My Health Record your health information can be viewed securely online from anywhere, at any time - even if you move or travel interstate. You and your healthcare providers can also access your health information from any computer or device that's connected to the internet.

An increase of 120,000 records since July 2020 and 20,000 in the last month.



89% of all records now have data in them



What's inside?

2.74B Documents uploaded to My Health Record

From medical histories to the latest blood tests, from pathology reports to advanced care plans, more vital health information is now securely stored and available when needed.

There are more than 350M documents in the system that have been uploaded by consumers or healthcare providers.

Nearly 129M Clinical Documents
Documents uploaded by a healthcare provider like hospitals, pathologists and radiologists.

An increase of more than 6 million documents in March

223M Medicine Documents
Documents uploaded by healthcare providers like pharmacies and GPs.

An increase of more than 9 million documents in March

Nearly 2.4B Medicare Documents
Documents uploaded by government agencies like Services Australia and Veterans' Affairs.

358K Consumer Documents
Documents uploaded by people



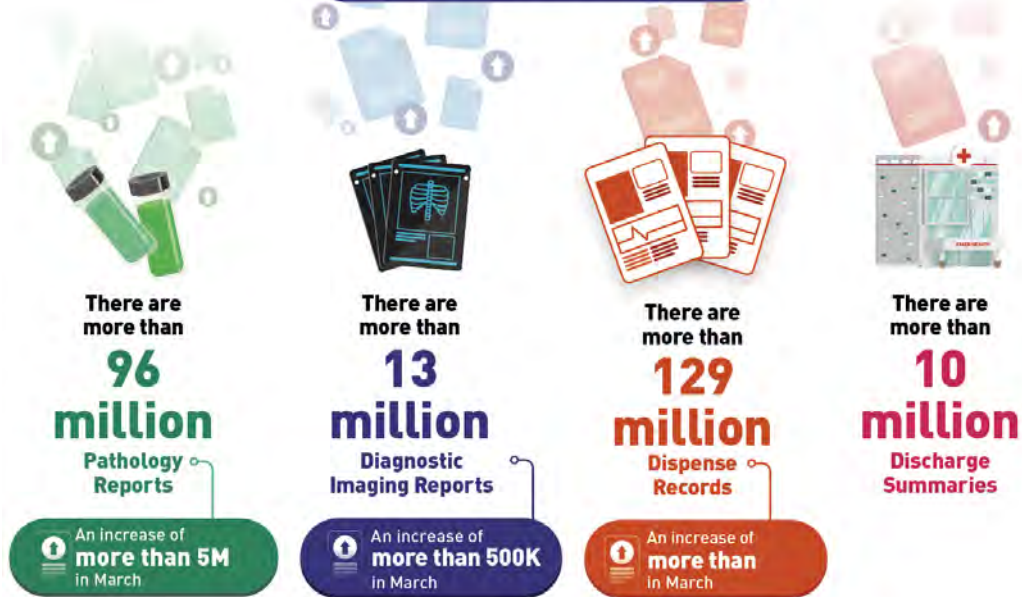
Key Insight

There have been 67,000 people who have registered for a My Health Record that had previously opted out and another 11,000 registered that had previously cancelled their record.

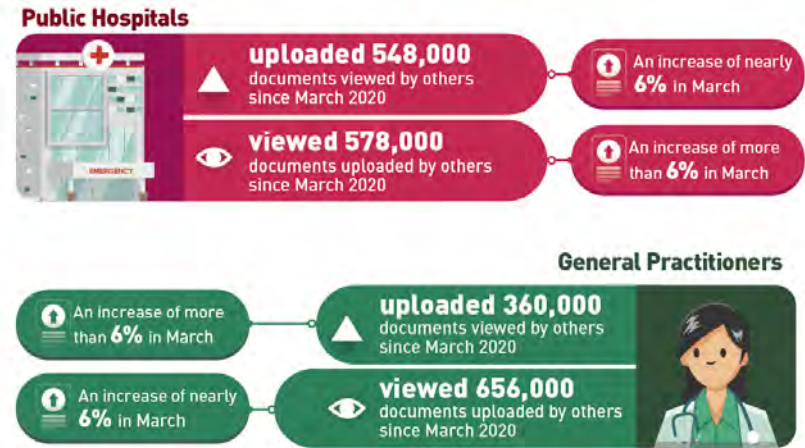

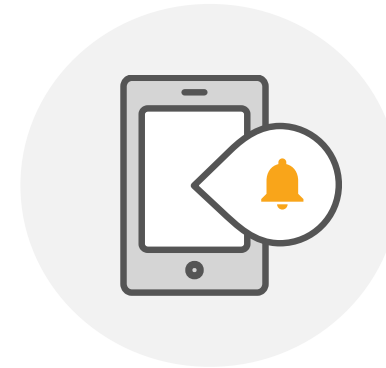

My Health Record security



- Many safeguards are in place to protect the My Health Record system
- These include strong encryption, firewalls, secure login processes and audit logging.



- The Agency's Cyber Security Centre monitors the system
- Health information in the system is protected by legislation
- Significant penalties apply for deliberate misuse.



- All data within the system is stored securely in Australia
- External software goes through a conformance process before it is allowed to connect.



Viewing and Consent

Must you view My Health Record for every patient?

When should I view the individual's My Health Record?

Healthcare providers are under no legal obligation to use the My Health Record system. It is up to the healthcare provider and his or her clinical judgement as to when and how they use the system. However, examples of when it might be relevant to see if a patient has a My Health Record are outlined below.

Do you need to obtain consent?

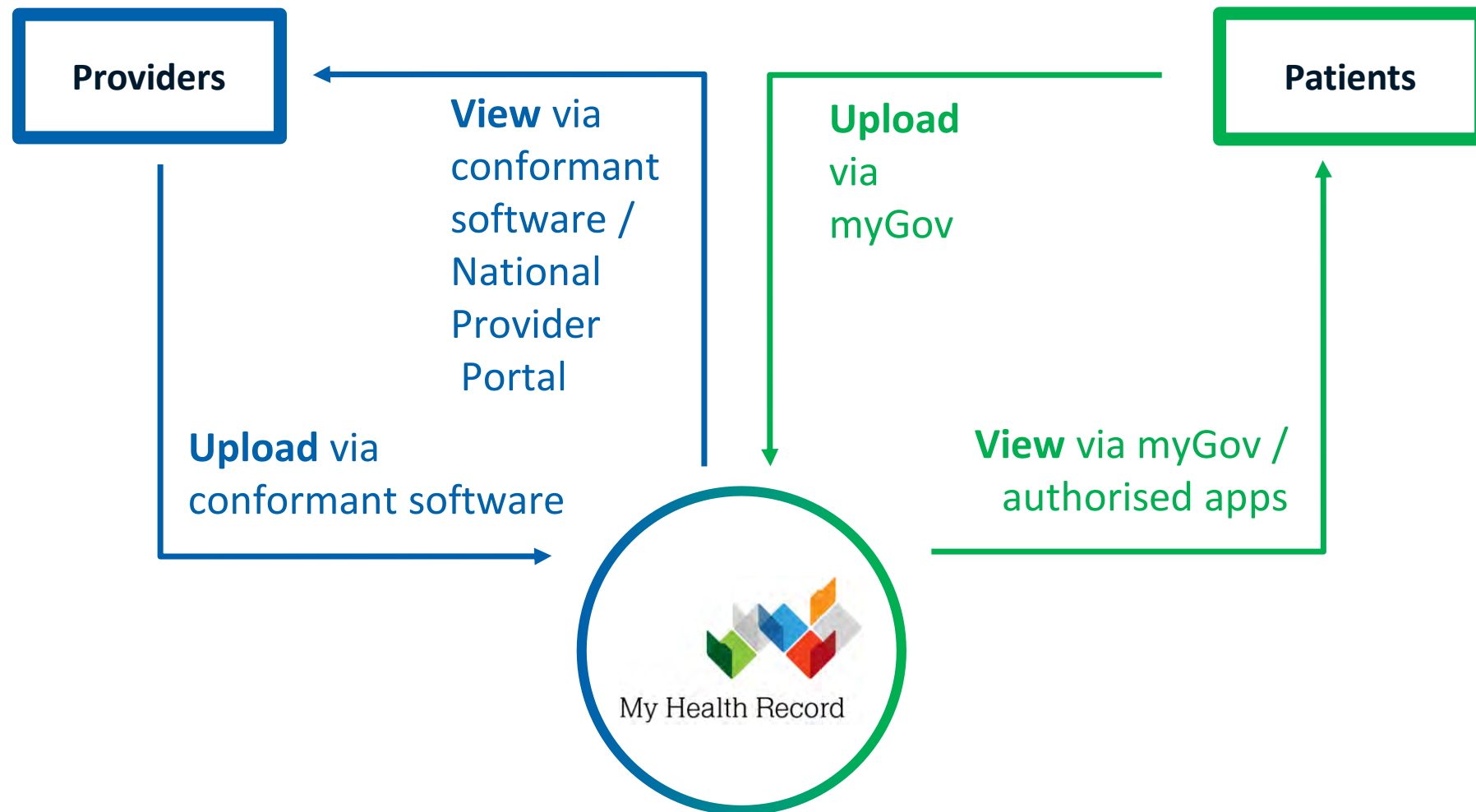
Patient Consent

- A provider is authorised to view a record when providing healthcare to the patient
- A provider is authorised to upload clinical documents without gaining consent of a patient each and every time
- Best practice is to discuss with patient if the document contains sensitive information

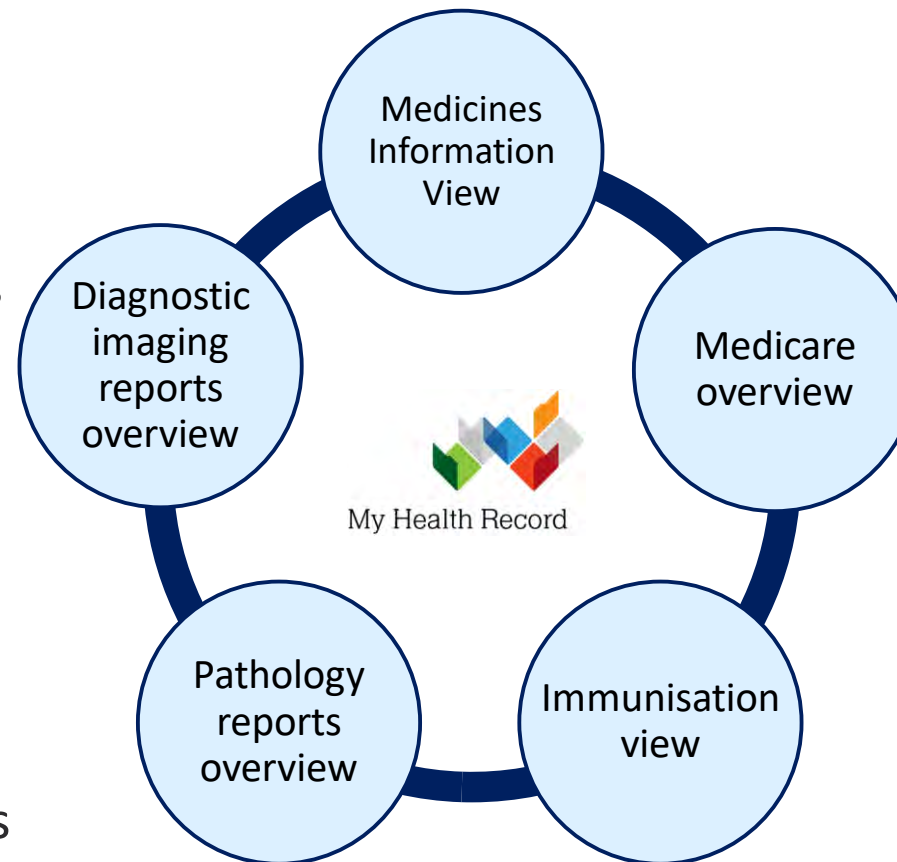

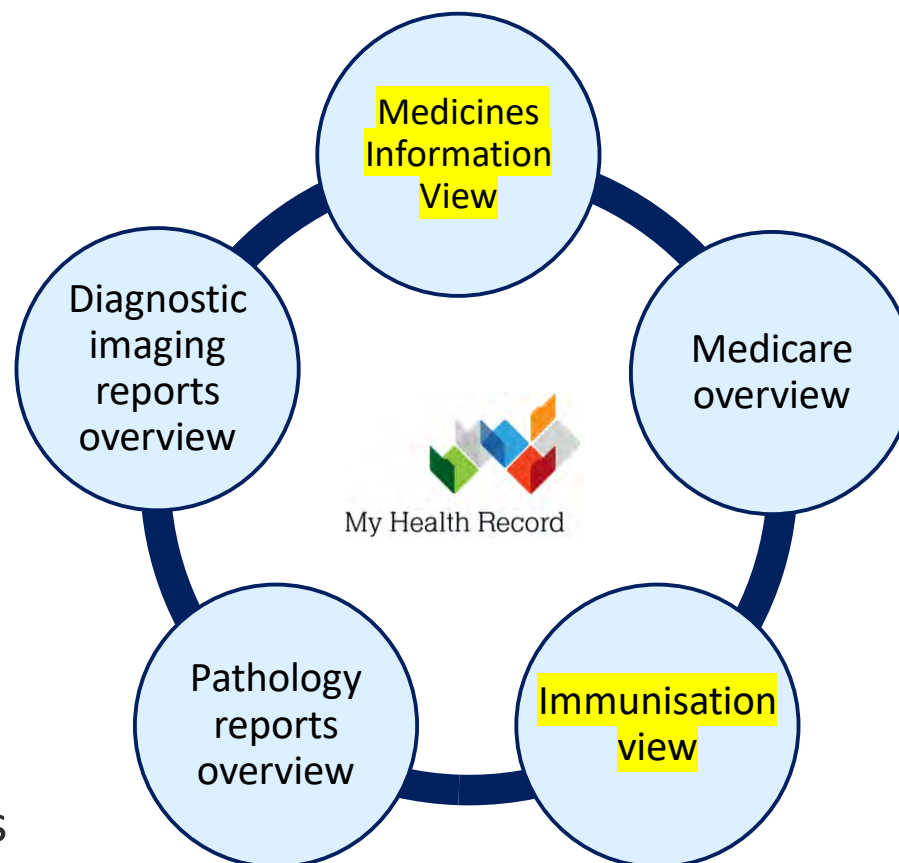

Patient control

How can consumers engage with their My Health Record?



Consumers can choose to **restrict access to specific documents** in their My Health Record by setting a code (LDAC)

Only organisations given the LDAC can access those documents



Consumers can **restrict access to their record** by setting a code (RAC)

Only organisations given the RAC can access any part of their My Health Record



In an emergency, a clinician can exercise a **'break glass'** facility to allow temporary access



Consumers can choose to receive an **SMS or email alert** when a health provider organisation accesses their My Health Record



All instances of access to My Health Record are **monitored and logged**

Nominated vs Authorised Representatives

Nominated Representative

A person that an individual has invited to access their My Health Record, such as a family member, close friend or carer.

Authorised Representative

A person who is responsible for managing the My Health Record of someone who is not able to make decisions for themselves. This could be a parent, legal guardian or Enduring Power of Attorney (EPOA).

Residential Aged Care - Better access to healthcare information for you and your residents

My Health Record is designed to provide you with better access to healthcare information to support you in caring for your residents.

Access to key health information

Through the My Health Record you will have access to timely and current information about your residents such as:

- Shared health summaries which include a individual's medical history, immunisations, medicines, allergies and adverse drug reactions
- Hospital discharge summaries
- Event summaries from treating clinicians
- Prescription and dispense records
- Medicines information view
- Pathology reports and diagnostic imaging reports
- Specialist letters
- Advance care planning documents and custodian information
- MBS and PBS history

Examples of how you can use the My Health Record system

- When seeing a resident for the first time, you can view their health information in their shared health summary, such as any chronic conditions they may have, current medicines they may be taking, and allergies and adverse drug reactions
- When consulting with a resident, you can communicate information about your treatment, findings and recommendations with others involved in the resident's care via an event summary.

Access the My Health Record system

There are two ways through which authorised healthcare providers can access individuals' records in the My Health Record system:

Conformant software

Accessing the My Health Record system through conformant clinical software enables healthcare providers to upload, view and download information from an individual's My Health Record.

National Provider Portal

If a healthcare provider does not have access to conformant software, they can view an individual's My Health Record through the National Provider Portal at <https://portal.ehealth.gov.au>. The healthcare provider will be able to view and download information from the individual's My Health Record, but will not be able to upload any clinical information.
