

The Health Alliance is a joint initiative between Metro North Health and Brisbane North PHN. Our vision is for people to experience a seamless, integrated and navigable system of care that delivers quality health outcomes in the North Brisbane and Moreton Bay region.

The results speak for themselves. The Alliance has:



Developed Care Collective – a pilot initiative to provide more holistic and coordinated care for patients living with chronic conditions like COPD, CHF and frequently present to hospital emergency departments, with and initial evaluation showing:

- 77% reduction in monthly emergency department presentations.
- ROI of \$2,474 per client/month and \$311,488 average savings/month based on avoided emergency presentations.

The initial pilot has been successfully expanded from the Caboolture region to Redcliffe.



Developed the Staring Well initiative which enables families with the greatest need to access joint maternity and child health activity beginning in the antenatal period. Beginning as a pilot in Caboolture Hospital, the initiative has seen an increase in babies born in the normal weight range, 91% of babies born at full term (compared to 86% across the wider maternity service) and high levels of patients satisfaction.

Our Mission

Our mission is to work strategically and collaboratively, taking a systems approach to solving challenges that no organisation can solve on its own.

Our Approach

We take a joint approach to governance and decision-making to:

- prioritise and accelerate initiatives of strategic importance
- provide a platform for health innovation and co-commissioning, where patient-centred ideas and models are developed, tested and evaluated
- share and amplify innovation learnings
- exercise influence and shape policy and funding levers to expand opportunities for improving healthcare in our region.

The current priorities of the Alliance include:



Trialling the provision of a shared care model of Hospital in the Home for First Nations clients to improve the management and care of diseases and/or illnesses that are the leading contributors to the health gap experienced by Indigenous peoples.



Designing a collective impact approach to overcome fragmentation and improve health outcomes for children and families in the Caboolture region.



Establishing a co-commissioning model to enable better outcomes from mental health funding provided to the region.



Trialling a proactive care coordination and case management model to improve access to care closer to home and reduce demand on Emergency Departments (EDs).
