Overview

- Queensland Government's \$265m commitment to deliver seven Satellite Hospitals
- Confirmed sites: Gold Coast, Ipswich, Redland, Brisbane Southside, **Bribie Island, Caboolture and Kallangur**
- Intended to support public healthcare delivery in rapidly growing communities.
- Each facility will provide healthcare services that are more appropriately delivered in the community, closer to home and in a more convenient setting, and:
 - will deliver a range of services informed by the needs of the community
 - incorporate outpatient community-based healthcare services with virtual healthcare opportunities to service the local community
 - will offer simple day-therapy services such as complex wound management and care for minor injuries and illnesses.



Design and construction

- Requirement for the seven Satellite Hospitals to be operational in 2023, which requires an accelerated delivery program.
- Ministerial infrastructure designation (MID) - allows for the delivery of essential community infrastructure.
- Hutchison Builders is the satellite hospital program's managing contractor
- A 1.6-hectare site at Bongaree selected for Bribie Island
- A 1.5-hectare site at Kallangur selected for Pine Rivers
- A parcel of land on Rowe Street selected for Caboolture
- Construction of Metro North's three satellite hospitals will occur throughout 2022. Aiming for 2023 completion.
 - Construction underway at Caboolture
 - Develop designs 80% completed for all three
 - Working through Indigenous Land Use Agreement at Kallangur and Bribie Island

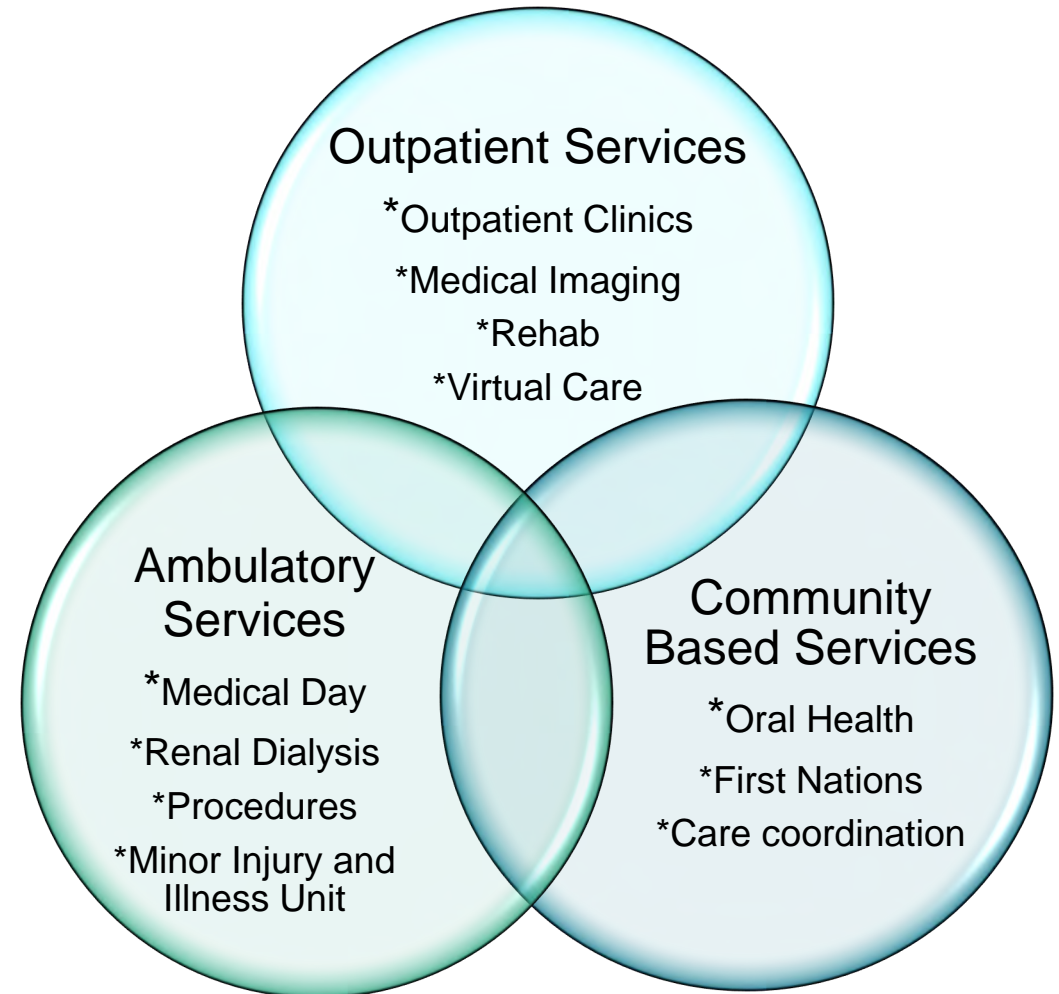

Models of care

- The range of services were informed by the needs of the community and are a little different for each facility
- Services will include day-therapy services such as complex wound management and care for minor injuries and illnesses. Patients requiring more urgent care for trauma or chronic and emergency health issues will still need to visit the major hospital in their region for treatment.
- Provision of renal dialysis and day medical procedures at Bribe Island and Kallangur, closer to where people live, is anticipated to significantly reduce the requirement for people to visit their local hospital, and will provide an alternative to renal patients having to travel to Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital to access renal dialysis.
- The Satellite Hospitals will also incorporate outpatient community-based healthcare services to service the local community, including access to rehabilitation services, mental health services, and oral health services.
- It is anticipated that the new Satellite Hospitals will help take pressure off our busy emergency departments



Kallangur Satellite Facility

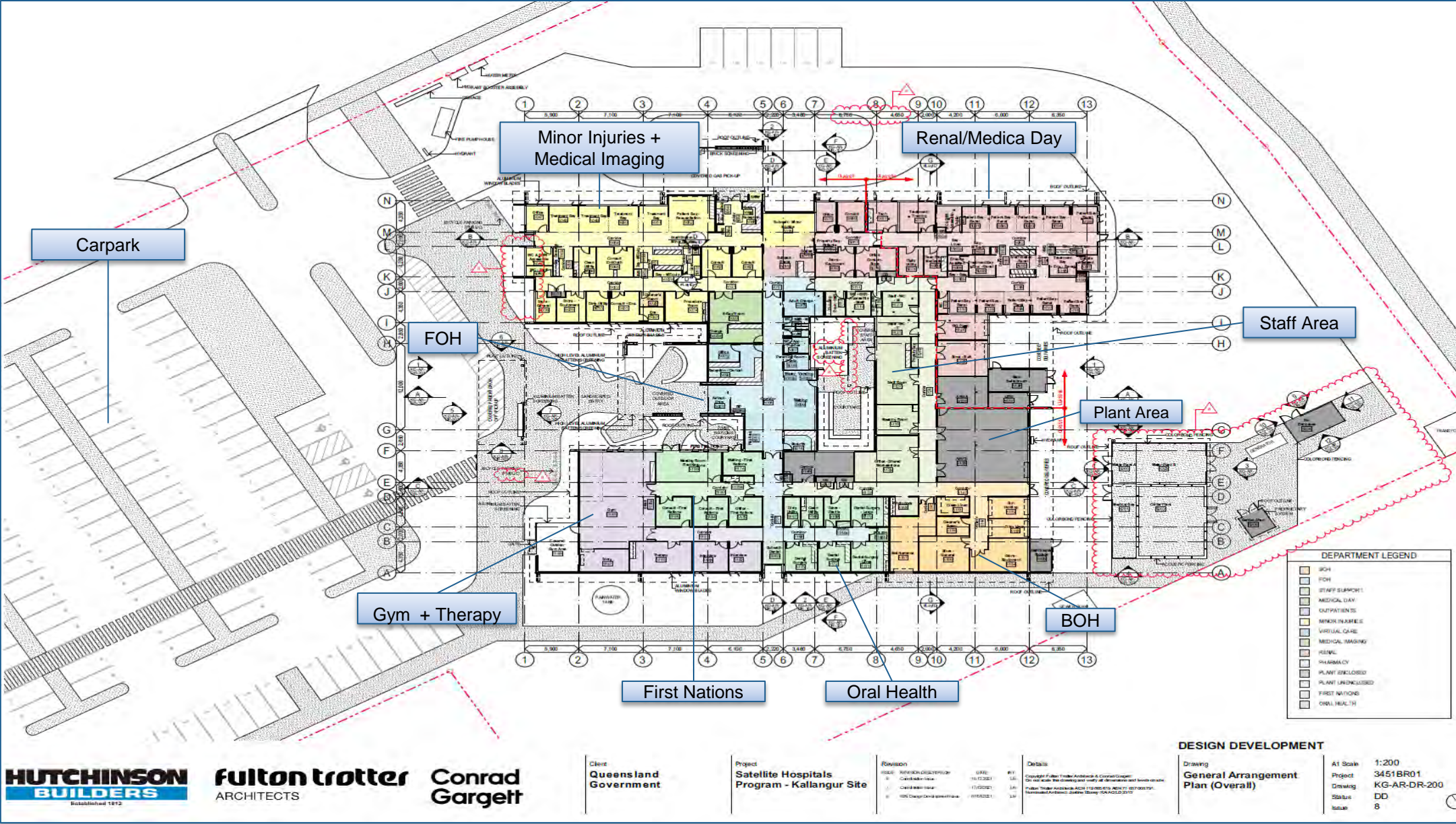
- Geographic catchment comprises North Lakes, Bald Hills, Cashmere, Dayboro and Strathpine regions.
